Carol Kranowitz Coming to Solomons, MD

On November 13, 2015, the Southern Maryland Collaborative for Families of Children with Disabilities will welcome Carol Kranowitz to the Holiday Inn in Solomons, MD as she presents *The Out-of-Sync Child: Sensory Challenges and Sensible Solutions*.

Ms. Kranowitz is best known to the autism community for her books, *The Out-of-Sync Child* and *The Out-of-Sync Child Has Fun*, as well as for activity books, all on the topic of Sensory Processing Disorder (SPD), a condition in which the brain has trouble receiving and responding to information that comes in through the senses.

This all-day presentation for parents, educators, therapists, and other professionals will review how SPD plays out at home and school and how to recognize underlying sensory issues. The program will offer sensory strategies and fun and functional "In-Sync" activities, which benefit *all* children in the family and classroom.

The Autism Spectrum Support Group of Southern Maryland is pleased to be a member organization of the Southern Maryland Collaborative for Families of Children with Disabilities. Bringing expert speakers to St. Mary's, Calvert, and Charles Counties is an expensive undertaking; individual organizations don't have the budgets necessary to cover the costs. 
